2102.18 Taking a Case Back to Court

Requirement

Take a case back to court when:

- Parents fail to comply with critical elements of the case plan;
- Request for a change of custody is recommended;
- Request for a change in the specific provisions of the court order is needed;
- The time limitation of the order is nearing expiration and it is necessary to request an extension of the order; or,
- Goals of the case plan have been met and it is appropriate to request to be relieved of custody/court ordered supervision.

This is not an all inclusive list. When working with families, other circumstances effecting individual situations are sometimes identified and will need to be brought to the court's attention.
